Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon honors St. Mary's Catholic Church in Corvallis with service award

St. Mary's Catholic Church in Corvallis will be honored with an "Ecumenical Service Award" on May 12, 2011, at the Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (EMO) Annual Community Awards & Celebration Dinner. The award is presented in recognition of St. Mary's special achievements in hope inspiring, life enhancing, Christ-centered ecumenical community ministry in Oregon.

St. Mary's describes itself as "a large Catholic community whose focus centers on God's Love and whose desire is to live and spread the Gospel by being true disciples in mission." The parish's service to its community is multifaceted and its commitment is deep. A diverse thread of its ministries—including hunger and food security, care for creation, Hispanic ministry, health and social justice—recently combined efforts to intentionally bring together Anglo and Hispanic families in its community garden, located within a larger ecumenical garden. The garden benefits its St. Vincent DePaul food pantry and families on tight budgets growing their own food, while also fostering environmental stewardship and education.

St. Mary's has been a key faith leader in community food security efforts in Benton County. For over five years, the parish hosted EMO's Interfaith Food and Farm Partnership staff office with warm hospitality. It also helped to organize community events for groups such as Ten Rivers Food Web, the Congregational Wellness Coalition, Oregon Food Bank's FEAST program, and more.
